### Creativity

#### I will be creative.

Being creative is *dangerous*. You'll need to spill a part of your soul on to a page or a canvas.. and you'll be judged for it. The risk is worth the reward.

## I will try new things.

Go out, explore a place you've never been to. Eat food from a country you can't even pronounce. Try a new tool or technique. See the world through the eyes of a child, and not the old, tired eyes that you've come to accept as part of adulthood.

## I will create novel things.

The world does not end with the serious.

Novel things, when used in the right way, can change the world.. or the way we see it.

Don't be afraid of novelty, despite its childish feel.

## I will create things of value.

Every creation you make will be something of value. If it doesn't mean something to you, it may not be the project you were hoping for. Incorporate pieces of yourself into everything you do, and they will be valuable to at least one person in the world, and most likely, many more.

# I will think for myself.

Don't listen to anyone 100%. Take the lessons that others give you, and combine them with your own. There will never be a better you than you are, and you will never be as good of a them as they are. Be content with being you, and you will grow into someone worthy of your name.

# I will not give up, nor will I give in.

Creativity is hard. Life is hard. All of the good things? Hard. Decide what you want to do and go for it. This is your life. If you try for something with everything in your heart, you will have that much more of a chance of getting it than if you only try halfway.

# I will believe in myself.

When you were little, you learned to walk... because you believed that you could. You learned to run by the same mechanism. Why should we stop believing in ourselves as adults?
